adults experience a mental illness each year.

**53,000** Montana adults have a serious mental illness.

1 in 5 of the more than 2,500 people in Montana who are unhoused have a serious mental illness.

adults have **serious thoughts of suicide** each year.

**52,000** Montana adults have serious thoughts of suicide each year.

329

lives were **lost to suicide** in Montana in 2022.

234,000

adults in Montana have a mental health condition. That's more than 7x the population of **Helena**.

U.S. adolescents aged 12-17 experience a **major depressive episode** each year.

**18,000** Montana adolescents experience a **major depressive episode** each year.

adults in Montana reported needing mental health treatment but not receiving it between 2018-2019. **Cost is a prevailing factor** in not receiving treatment.
